<p>2.0 Council Business</p>	<p>Alice Taylor made a motion to approve the April 25th minutes and Ben Cannon seconded the motion. It was unanimously approved.</p>

<p>4.0 Advanced Health updates</p>	<p>Updates from Curry County:</p> <p>Jesse's updates:</p> <p>Laura Williams and Bonnie Ell thanked everyone who took the time to write letters of support for Advanced Health's CCO 2.0 application submission, which help to support the work we're doing in the community.</p> <p>Laura provided an update on the new collaborative Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) that is being developed. On June 4th from 1-3 pm, the next community CHIP meeting will take place and will help determine the next steps for how we will move forward with the new CHIP and subcommittee projects</p> <p>Sharon Daymond asked for both an email and text to help remind her of the CHIP meeting.</p> <p>Bonnie Ell provided an update on the first Family Cafe that took place on May 16 in Brookings- the theme being 'Grandparents Raising Their Grandchildren.' The grandparents who attended were grateful to have the support and connection</p>

Bonnie also provided an update on the film showing of 'Paper Tigers' that will be shown free of charge on June 19th at 7 pm at Brookings Church of the Nazarene.</p> <p>Bonnie also mentioned that Every Child Curry County will be partnering with United Way as their non-profit backbone. Every Child is a community-based wrap around program to support foster children, foster families and DHS.</p> <p>Sharon Daymond asked if Every Child would be a CHIP initiative and Laura Williams mentioned that it could be.</p> <p>Bonnie mentioned that Advanced Health is sponsoring free swimming throughout the summer in Brookings from 12-4 pm.</p>		
<p>5.0 Healthy Bytes</p>	<p>Stephanie Polizzi presented 'Healthy Bytes' to the CAC. The Healthy Bytes Initiative is a partner networking project designed to unify health messaging across multiple community sites.</p> <p>Stephanie is requesting that each community partner volunteer to take materials and distribute them regularly to x amount of businesses.</p> <p>A volunteer coordinator is also needed to take this project on for Curry County.</p> <p>Otterbees (Catherine, who is on the AllCare CAC)- Alice Taylor mentioned that Otterbees might be interested in this opportunity, and possibly someone at the Farmers Market.</p> <p>Margie House mentioned that Cathy Boden with the Curry Food Watershed might be a good connection for Healthy Bytes, and Mellissah Hendrickson mentioned that the company she</p>		



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	<p>works for, South Coast Business Connection, might also be a good point person.</p> <p>Alice Taylor requested that Stephanie draft a Healthy Bytes volunteer job description for Curry County.</p> <p>There was discussion about Healthy Bytes falling under our CHIP- possibly by providing a grant to purchase a printer to be housed in Curry County and possibly a funded position to help coordinate the program. Laura suggested that materials could be brought monthly to the CAC and that partners take the materials out to distribute.</p>		
<p>6.0 Community Partner Updates</p>	<p>Wally's House- Curry County Commissioner's voted for all child abuse intervention work to be done through Wally's House to be done as a stand alone non-profit separate from the County.</p> <p>South Coast Business- funds to hire a youth crew July-Sept to work with the Forest Service- paid positions- to develop work skills and future employment opportunities.</p> <p>Finding Hope- Deadline is June 28th for recognition in the magazine for for grant funders. Gordon Clay has social media posts, flyers and links of information for those interested in taking part in this community based program to help prevent suicide. Gordon stated that suicide is at an all-time high throughout the U.S., Oregon and Curry County. Suicide is the 2nd leading cause of death for 10 to 34 year olds.</p> <p>ORCCA- Beth Barker-Hidalgo mentioned that videoconferencing is now an option with Consumer Credit Counseling Services for Curry County and Legal Aid Services visited the Brookings office and will be expanding services and will do an in-take over the phone if their</p>		



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	<p>services are needed when they aren't in town (1 1/2 days a month).</p> <p>Curry Community Health (CCH)- Beth Beasley mentioned that they are currently on their summer youth schedule.</p> <p>CCH brought on a new medical doctor in primary care from the Rogue Valley, which will allow them to offer new procedures including, joint injections, laceration repair, etc.</p> <p>Oasis Shelter Home- June 1st @ 6:00 pm there will be a fundraising at Kuhn Thai in Brookings with multiple award-winning local musicians. www.oasisadvocacy.org for more information.
