See the 2/3/21 public hearing with testimony from Oregon Alliance to Prevent Suicide. <p>Here is an overview around the bill and the LGBTQ2SIA+ Student Success Plan. HB 2949: Requires Mental Health Regulatory Agency to establish program to improve Black, indigenous and people of color mental health workforce, including pipeline development, scholarships for undergraduates and stipends for graduate students, loan repayments and retention activities. HB 3045: Extends the sunset of the Mental Health Clinical Advisory Group to January 2, 2026. Provides exception for Oregon Health Authority to pay for non-generic mental health drugs in which prescription specifies "dispense as written." Adds mental health drugs prescribed in the last year to the list of drugs for which OHA may not require prior authorization.</p> <p>Direct the Pharmacy and Therapeutics Committee to take recommendations from Mental Health Clinical Advisory Group on mental health drugs. The Supporting Health for All through Reinvestment, or SHARE Initiative, was developed by the Oregon Health Authority (OHA) to implement the legislative requirement of House Bill 4018 (Oregon Legislature, 2018) which aims to address Social Determinants of Health (SDOH). The primary goals are to: (1) Safeguard public dollars by requiring that a portion of Coordinated Care Organization’s (CCO’s) profits are reinvested in their respective communities; and, (2) Improve Member and community health by requiring reinvestments go toward upstream factors that impact health.</p> <p>Social Determinants of Health and Health Equity (SDOH+E) means the social, economic, political, and environmental conditions in which</p>		



	<p>people are born, grow, work, live, and age. These conditions significantly impact length and quality of life and contribute to health inequities. Social Determinants of Health include, but are not limited to: poverty; education; employment; food insecurity; diaper insecurity; housing; access to quality child care; environmental conditions; trauma/adverse childhood experiences; and transportation.</p> <p>SDOH+E means the systemic or structural factors that shape the unfair distribution of the social determinants of health in communities. Institutional racism is one example. Health Equity occurs when all people can reach their full health potential and well-being and are not disadvantaged by their race, ethnicity, language, disability, gender, gender identity, sexual orientation, social class, or other socially determined circumstances. Together, SDOH+E is the combined factors of the Social Determinants of Health and the Social Determinants of Health Equity.</p> <p>Advanced Health, a CCO providing Medicaid services to Members residing in Coos and Curry Counties of Oregon, requests Applications from qualified Applicants pursuant to the SHARE Initiative.
