1.0 Call to Order	Beth Barker-Hidalgo called the meeting to order at 12:00 pm.

3.0 Advanced Health updates	<p>Bonnie Ell gave a reminder that the Curry Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) progress report is underway and thanked those who have submitted information regarding CHIP related activities.</p> <p>Bonnie also reminded the CAC that the Curry CHIP Coalition meets 1st Wed/month, 2-4 pm: https://allcarehealth.zoom.us/j/98554749338?pwd=cWhpQWRhR1owT1JuYjRGTlp2cXQxQT09</p> <p>Lisa announced language translation interpretation services are available to Members through video interpretation in any language.</p>		
4.0 Updates from Advanced Health Chief Medical Officer	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Advanced Health Chief Medical Officer announced that there have been a number of updates made to the Advanced Health website to help make it more user friendly and we welcome feedback from our CAC members. - Dr. Sharman provided an update on HCV- Hepatis C Virus (formerly called non-A, non-B) and noted that we have robust and highly effective treatment for this virus. There are still some access barriers however to everyone accessing this treatment. - Pilot project lead by Peer Support members at Bay Area First Step- ask individuals if they're interested in being screened- over 3 dozen individuals are now being treated thanks to telehealth medicine and peer support specialists serving Coos county. 		

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Beth Barker-Hidalgo asked how Bay Area First Step could support Curry members and if she could be connected to help recruit consumers in Curry for the project. Dr. Sharman and Bonnie will follow-up with Beth to help connect her with information about expansion of this program to Curry. - Treatment for OPIOD misuse disorder- over 500,000 deaths in the U.S. due to OPIOD abuse. In partnership with Bay Area First Step, ADAPT, Advanced Health and others, they are able to reach community members who otherwise would have barriers in accessing services - Corrinne asked what steps are being done regarding information sharing and outreach to help the community better understand these topics, such as Hep C.
